# Institute Keynote Speaker



Rachel Moon is a pediatrician and sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS) researcher at the University of Virginia. She received her medical degree from Emory University and completed her pediatric residency at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. She is the Harrison Distinguished Teaching Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Virginia School of Medicine. Her research centers on SIDS, SIDS risk factors, and how parents make decisions. She is Chair of the American Academy of Pediatrics' Task Force on SIDS and the Associate Editor of Digital Media for the journal, *Pediatrics*.

### Keynote Session - Uncovering Sleep Strategies for Infants and Toddlers

Effective sleep strategies are more than just rocking and singing. Ensuring the safety of Virginia's infants and toddlers is a top priority along with interactions before and during sleep. In this presentation, Dr. Moon explains what effective sleep strategies look like and eliminates any myths surrounding them.

#### **Workshop Objectives**

The workshop sessions will be presented by highly qualified infant and toddler specialists and infant and toddler behavior consultants from nine regions across the state. As part of their work with the VA Infant & Toddler Specialist Network, they provide professional development and coaching to early care providers.

#### Sessions for Caregivers

#### Healthy Sleep - Happy Baby

Infant care is more than feeding and diapering. It involves being in tune with the infant by recognizing and creating interactions throughout the day, understanding their communication, responding to their needs, and allowing them to find peace and enjoy rest.

Participants will learn practical tips in creating quality interactions with infants, discover ways to create healthy rest and sleep opportunities and identify ways to approach each infant's individual needs while in group care.

#### Play More - Rest Better

Toddler rest begins by providing opportunities to play and be active throughout the day. Creating interactions, establishing routines and offering appropriate activities all support rest in the toddler classroom.

In this workshop, providers will learn tips and strategies to help answer some of the most important questions concerning toddler rest such as, What exactly is rest for on-the-go toddlers? What if they just do not nap? What can I do to help them rest better?

#### Sessions for Directors and Family Day Home Owners

#### **REST Assured: Creating a Culture of Support**

Creating a peaceful, healthy and safe sleep environment begins with leadership. When staff receive support with their own routines, engaging interactions, safe environments and trusting relationships, they are best able to support the health and safety of infants and toddlers.

In this leadership workshop, participants will learn strategies to support staff wellness and explore the direct impact mindful and supported caregivers have on the health, safety and development of infants and toddlers.

#### The Dream Team: Collaborative Sleep Policies

Providing healthy and safe sleep environments for infants and toddlers in the group care setting goes beyond having a policy in place and leaders can't do it alone! A "Dream Team" of leaders, providers and families dedicated to child-focused sleep is essential.

Leaders attending this workshop will learn the importance of developing their own "Dream Team", keys to writing effective sleep policies, and strategies to clearly communicate and implement policies to ensure compliance.
